

What you need to know about the Nov. 3 Presidential Election

Virginians will be voting for:

- President and Vice President
- U.S. Senator from Virginia (one)
- U.S. House of Representatives (all districts)
- State constitutional amendments that would:
 - Create redistricting commission to draw congressional and state legislative maps
 - Exempt disabled veterans from paying motor vehicle property tax
- Local elections

Absentee, mail-in, and early voting are open to all, no excuse needed. Act early to make sure your vote is counted!

Important deadlines to make sure your vote is counted:

- Register to vote or update your registration NOW until Oct. 13
- Request absentee mail-in ballot online or by mail NOW until Oct. 23
 - Requested absentee ballots will be mailed beginning Sept. 18
- Vote early in-person between Sept. 18 and Oct. 31
- Postmark completed ballot or return in person to your <u>registrar</u> by 7 p.m. Nov. 3
 - Mailed ballot must be received by registrar by **noon Nov. 6**
- Vote in person at your polling place 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Nov. 3

NEW! Drop boxes for completed mail-in ballots will be available at registrar, satellite and polling locations. Check with your registrar for times and locations.
