

## Vote Nov. 8

### Register to vote if you're 18 by Election Day

#### Help shape Virginia's future!

- On the ballot will be candidates for U.S. House of Representatives and local races
- Visit [VOTE411.org](http://VOTE411.org), a nonpartisan voters' guide published by LWV, to view your ballot and candidates' position statements

### College students who are Virginia residents can register using their home or school address

- Register using the Virginia address you consider your primary residence. A dormitory or college address is acceptable, but you may not use a P.O. Box, only a street address
- Your registration address determines your polling place and the General Registrar office where you can vote early in person or return a mail-in ballot
- You may ask that a mail-in ballot be sent to your location (if it is outside the city or county of your primary residence) on the absentee ballot application
- If you change your primary residence address, you must update your registration
- **Contact your school advisors to learn whether your tuition or financial aid would be affected if your voter registration address differs from their records!**

### Vote by mail, early in person, or on Election Day

#### Important deadlines to make sure your vote is counted:

- Register to vote or update your registration until **Oct. 17**
- Request mail-in ballot as early as **Sept. 23**
  - Requested ballots will be mailed beginning **Sept. 23**
- Vote early at your registrar or satellite office **Sept. 23-Nov. 5**
  - Saturday voting on Oct. 29 and Nov. 5 ends at 5 p.m.
- Mail-in ballots may be returned in person to your local voter registration office, or postmarked by 7 p.m. Nov. 8 (registrar must receive mailed ballots by noon Nov. 14)
- Vote in person at your polling place **6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Nov. 8**

## Am I eligible to vote?

- Yes, if you are a citizen of the United States and resident of Virginia, at least 18-years-old by Nov. 8, have had your capacity restored if you have ever been adjudicated mentally incapacitated or had voting rights restored after a felony conviction. ## Where do I register to vote or update my registration?

- Online (with DMV ID) at: [elections.virginia.gov/citizen-portal/](https://elections.virginia.gov/citizen-portal/)
  - Without DMV ID, you can complete the application online, print, sign, and mail as directed
  - Download form (at Elections' Voter Forms), complete by hand and mail
- Any DMV office (online or in person)
- Any voter registration office or voter registration drive
- Some state agencies, such as Social Services or Health, when applying for or renewing services
- Check your registration status at the Citizen Portal or call your local General Registrar (find phone number at: [vote.elections.virginia.gov/VoterInformation/PublicContactLookup](https://vote.elections.virginia.gov/VoterInformation/PublicContactLookup)) or call (800) 552-9745).

## How do I vote by mail?

- Request an absentee ballot online (with DMV ID) at: [elections.virginia.gov/citizen-portal/](https://elections.virginia.gov/citizen-portal/)
  - You may download a form (at Elections' Voter Forms), complete by hand and mail
- Absentee ballot application forms are available at voter registration offices

*When you receive your ballot packet, read instructions carefully. Be sure you complete, sign and get a witness signature before mailing the ballot in the pre-paid postage envelope.*

## How do I know my mail-in ballot was received?

- You can track your ballot on the [Citizen Portal](#) or call your General Registrar with questions.

## What documents do I need to cast a ballot?

- Photo ID is no longer required at the polls, however, you will need some form of valid ID
- Acceptable ID documents include:
  - Correspondence or card from your local General Registrar confirming your registration
  - DMV-issued driver's license (current or expired) or ID card
  - U.S. passport or any ID card issued by U.S., Virginia or local Virginia government
  - A student ID card issued by a Virginia college, university or high school, or U.S. college or university photo ID
  - Employer-issued photo ID card
  - Any current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck or government document with your name and address. Acceptable IDs are listed at: [elections.virginia.gov/casting-a-ballot/in-person-voting/](https://elections.virginia.gov/casting-a-ballot/in-person-voting/)
