Register to vote if you're 18 by Election Day

Help shape Virginia's future!

- On the ballot will be candidates for U.S. House of Representatives and local races
- Visit <u>VOTE411.org</u>, a nonpartisan voters' guide published by LWV, to view your ballot and candidates' position statements

College students who are Virginia residents can register using their home or school address

- Register using the Virginia address you consider your primary residence. A dormitory or college address is acceptable, but you may not use a P.O. Box, only a street address
- Your registration address determines your polling place and the General Registrar office where you can vote early in person or return a mail-in ballot
- You may ask that a mail-in ballot be sent to your location (if it is outside the city or county of your primary residence) on the absentee ballot application
- If you change your primary residence address, you must update your registration
- Contact your school advisors to learn whether your tuition or financial aid would be affected if your voter registration address differs from their records!

Vote by mail, early in person, or on Election Day

Important deadlines to make sure your vote is counted:

- Register to vote or update your registration until Oct. 17
- Request mail-in ballot as early as Sept. 23
 - Requested ballots will be mailed beginning Sept. 23
- Vote early at your registrar or satellite office Sept. 23-Nov. 5
 - Saturday voting on Oct. 29 and Nov. 5 ends at 5 p.m.
- Mail-in ballots may be returned in person to your local voter registration office, or postmarked by 7 p.m. Nov. 8 (registrar must receive mailed ballots by noon Nov. 14)
- Vote in person at your polling place 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Nov. 8

Voting is Power

Am I eligible to vote?

 Yes, if you are a citizen of the United States and resident of Virginia, at least 18-years-old by Nov. 8, have had your capacity restored if you have ever been adjudicated mentally incapacitated or had voting rights restored after a felony conviction. Where do I register to vote or update my registration?

- Online (with DMV ID) at: <u>elections.virginia.gov/citizen-portal/</u>
 - Without DMV ID, you can complete the application online, print, sign, and mail as directed
 - o Download form (at Elections' Voter Forms), complete by hand and mail
- Any DMV office (online or in person)
- Any voter registration office or voter registration drive
- Some state agencies, such as Social Services or Health, when applying for or renewing services
- Check your registration status at the Citizen Portal or call your local General Registrar (find phone number at: wote.elections.virginia.gov/Voterlnformation/PublicContactLookup) or call (800) 552-9745).

How do I vote by mail?

- Request an absentee ballot online (with DMV ID) at: <u>elections.virginia.gov/citizen-portal/</u>
 - o You may download a form (at Elections' Voter Forms), complete by hand and mail
- Absentee ballot application forms are available at voter registration offices

When you receive your ballot packet, read instructions carefully. Be sure you complete, sign and get a witness signature before mailing the ballot in the pre-paid postage envelope.

How do I know my mail-in ballot was received?

• You can track your ballot on the Citizen Portal or call your General Registrar with questions.

What documents do I need to cast a ballot?

- Photo ID is no longer required at the polls, however, you will need some form of valid ID
- Acceptable ID documents include:
 - o Correspondence or card from your local General Registrar confirming your registration
 - o DMV-issued driver's license (current or expired) or ID card
 - U.S. passport or any ID card issued by U.S., Virginia or local Virginia government
 - A student ID card issued by a Virginia college, university or high school, or U.S. college or university photo ID
 - o Employer-issued photo ID card
 - Any current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck or government document with your name and address. Acceptable IDs are listed at: elections.virginia.gov/casting-a-ballot/in-person-voting/
